

Wildlife iDots to do at school

Day 2

Check your grounds for signs of animals that have visited during the night



Day 4

Build bug hotels to encourage insects into your school grounds



Day 1

Check around all your fences for animals that may have become trapped



Day 3

Lift nets off the ground when finished with to prevent animals getting tangled in them



Day 5

Make sure to provide water sources for birds and insects to drink
